NBA's Bo Kimble Joins Trinity Financial Advisory Board

The impact of those events on Bo can be seen in the number of people he has positively influenced in the past 10 years."

ABOUT KIMBLE:

Gregory "Bo" Kimble, 43, is probably as well known for his college basketball career as he is for his pro career. A native of Philadelphia, Kimble played high school ball at Dobbins Technical High School where he and teammate/best friend Hank Gathers led the team to the league championship in 1985. The pair went on to play college basketball at USC and also at Loyola Marymount where they were an integral part of a historic Loyola Marymount offense that still

owns the five highest single game scoring totals in NCAA history, including the record-setting 186-point effort against U.S. International in 1990. After the tragic passing of Gathers in the 1990 West Coast Conference (WCC) Tournament, Kimble led the Lions to one of the most memorable post-season runs in NCAA Tournament history. The run was best symbolized by the right-handed Kimble shooting his first free throw in each NCAA Tournament game left-handed in memory of Gathers. As a result, Los Angeles County declared July 17, 1990, "Bo Kimble Day."

Kimble led the 11th-seeded Lions through the first two rounds of the tournament by recording 45 points and 18 rebounds in a 111-92 first round win over sixth-seeded New Mexico State and 37 points in a 149-115 second round win over defending champion and third-seeded Michigan. The Lions then beat seventh-seeded Alabama 62-60 in the West Regional Semifinals before falling to eventual national champion UNLV in the Elite Eight.

Kimble turned in one of the most prolific statistical seasons in WCC and NCAA history as a senior in 1990 by leading the nation in scoring with 35.3 points per game. He was named WCC Player of the Year, a six-time WCC Player of the Week and a Second-Team All-American in his senior season. He is ranked number six in the NCAA in most points scored in a single season.

In the 1990 NBA draft, the 6'5" guard was picked by the LA Clippers. He played with the Clippers until 1992, when he was traded to the NY Knicks where he played one more season.

On January 29, 2005, Kimble and his teammates from the 1989-90 LMU team were inducted into the Loyola Marymount Hall of Fame, and in February 2010, he was inducted in the West Coast Conference Hall of Honors.

"I am honored to join the Trinity Financial Corporate Advisory Board," says Kimble. "I have a great deal of respect for Peter and am aware of some of the great things he has done for the NY Giants players, and when he asked I was honored to join."

"I look forward to anything I can do to benefit the community," Kimble adds.

Since leaving basketball, Kimble has dedicated his life to community service. He now devotes his time to the nonprofit organization Forty-Four for Life, which aims to decrease the rate of death and disability from life-threatening heart disease. The group focuses on heart disease prevention through public outreach, implementation of sports and recreations programs, training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and automated defibrillator use, and automated defibrillator donations.

Kimble adds that his game strategy for life is simple: helping others.

“There is no better way to give back or help a person than by saving their life or creating an opportunity to save a life. I have been blessed to have amazing mentors in my life, so I need to share what I have learned with others,” he adds.
