## **NFL's Jay Feely Joins Trinity Financial Advisory Board**

James “Jay” Feely is the placekicker for the Arizona Cardinals. At age 34, he is a veteran of the NFL who started his winning sports career as a teenager when his soccer team won a national championship. In high school, he set records for field goals and extra points. From there he went on to play college football at Michigan, and received an honorable mention for the All-Big Ten team.

Remarkably, he was not drafted in the 1999 NFL draft, so Feely kicked for the Florida Bobcats of the Arena Football League. In 2000, he kicked for the Tampa Bay Storm, and in April 2001, he signed with the Atlanta Falcons where he was an all-rookie selection. He also earned NFL Special Teams Player of the Week and NFC Special Teams Player of the Month honors.

In 2005, Feely signed with the NY Giants, where in a pre-season game against the NY Jets he scored all of his team’s points in the 15-14 victory by connecting on five field goals, including two over 50 yards.

In 2007, he signed with the Miami Dolphins. That year he missed just two of his 23 field goal attempts, setting a franchise record at 91.3% completions.

Feely was signed by the NY Jets in September 2008, where he continued to excel and break records. It was there that he recorded his first career punt when he was called into action unexpectedly after a teammate became ill.

In 2010, Feely signed with the Arizona Cardinals where he became the fourth kicker in 40 years to run for a touchdown, scoring a fake field goal against the Denver Broncos. Feely also kicked a career-high five field goals in that game, and at one point in the game was responsible for all 22 of the team’s points. He ultimately scored 25 points in the game, the most points scored by a player in a single game since 2007.
